Accident Investigation (DVD) 2013

Law enforcement personnel frequently face the risk of bloodborne pathogens. This video reviews the essential elements of exposure control, including work controls, housekeeping and personal protective equipment.

Brentwood (TN) Bank Robbery and Shootout (DVD) 2003

Disk # 513

Video depicts shootout with bank robbery suspect in Tennessee. The video breaks down how a shootout was handled by several officers. The suspect was killed and several officers were wounded.

Close Quarter Cuffing Techniques AND Edged Weapon Defense and Disarming (DVD) 2000 Disk # 452

Close Quarter Cuffing Techniques is a video for correction officers, providing easy-to-follow lessons and safety techniques. Edged Weapon Defense and Disarming discusses several positive techniques on how to avoid attacks with edged weapons. The scenarios presented are correctional situations.

Courtroom Testimony (DVD)

Disk # 523

One of the most crucial aspects of any officer's responsibilities is also one of the most difficult and least understood: courtroom testimony. Proper handling of oneself during courtroom proceedings can make or break cases for law enforcement. This program will feature proper tactics and courtroom procedure for cops from an expert in the field for officers who testify in a courtroom setting. Includes training guides.

Detecting Danger (DVD) 2001

Georgia State Trooper (DVD) 1995

Disk # 519

This program presents a traffic stop on a Georgia interstate that involves lethal force; an example of the hazards of any traffic stop and use of backup. In this case, backup was a critical issue. Backup procedures are also addressed in this program. Includes training guides.

Groundfighting for Smaller Officers (DVD) 2006

Smaller officers are confronted by larger people. Smaller size doesn't have to be a disadvantage. This DVD presents strategies to benefit female and small-stature officers in encounters with larger and stronger opponents, along with training regimens and factors to help officers gain and maintain tactical advantage. Less Lethal: Seattle Swordsman (DVD) 2000

Disk # 522

This program details the Seattle, Washington Police Department's efforts to disarm a mental subject who was waving and flourishing a samurai sword for hours in front of a Seattle restaurant. It details the department's efforts to disarm the subject with everything from verbal tactics, to beanbags, to a water cannon.

Managing Verbal Abuse: Law Enforcement/Verbal Judo 102 Series (DVD) 2008

This video is designed to prepare officers to face the intense verbal confrontation situations that they will encounter in their "real world" duty assignments. Safe at Home: Off Duty Encounters (DVD) 2007

Disk # 517

As police officers we spend a lot of time training and preparing for critical incidents on duty, but how much time do we spend training for a possible off-duty encounter. This course will drive home the understanding that just because you go off duty, doesn't mean you go off threat (15% of officer murders happen off duty). It will guide you through the process of educating your friends and family on the probability of off-duty incidents and will give you appropriate responses for these possible deadly encounters.

Search Warrant Process: Parts 1-2-3 (DVD) 2003

Swimmers who practice prolonged underwater breath-holding are particularly at risk of SWB. By rapidly breathing deeply prior to submersion (hyperventilation), swimmers blow off an excessive amount of carbon dioxide. When the oxygen level in the blood runs low before the carbon dioxide level rises to the point that triggers the breathing reflex, the swimmer loses consciousness. The swimmer never actually feels as though a breath is needed. Once submerged underwater, the swimmer is hidden from the view of lifeguards by surface glare and ripples/waves on the surface. A series of events is then triggered, including the inhalation of water, possible convulsions, and ultimately cardiac arrest and death.
